in Glaston配ext February，the main purpose being to establish innsbetween the local qreengroups，maorines，centres and fairs that have started upacere Oss the country over the last cuple or years．The weekend we have pooked the ist and ond of Eebruary is also the ancient Celtic Festival of Imole， as if we actually needed an excuse for celebration！

From the earliest days，the Green collective has been principaliy concerned with helping to establish local green groups and gatheringis． Recentiy a number of local green centres have been established，some．mnder the auspices of the Ecology／Green party，others dependant of any politirat faction．The Greerhouse project in Bangor is a good example of this an has heloed inspire plans for similar projects in other parts of Nales ant Eig－ land．Nominall奴 therea arenow some seventy groups around the countile of Britain．Very little is known about their progressthough，as there is no regular forum for the sharing of information on local activities．Green Line keeps track of some lncal activities but it＇s network pages donlt havesufficient room for a full sharing of news and ideas．

A number of local green maga ines in different parts of the countury have provided an invaluable service by sharing information on dernonstatuo ions，actions and groupsin their areas．Most of these maga ines are pic－ duced by only one or two people who soon tire．Conmmication betwerrr these different maga－ines will do a lot to overcome feelings of isolation anl staleness．Nany community initiatives outside the security if nationil organisations like CND or the Ecology Green party suffer from a lack is pport and information about what is going on in other areas．One wishet of this is that single，small．localgroups are easily dismíssed on ．$v$ 弘， ised．It is vital to remedy this．If they felt themselves includelat． were seen to be an affiliate of a much wider network，they would cau much more political weight．＂in a geruinely de－centraiist and colilulay o centred movement．Whereas a．political party is limited in its activiu by what is expected of it a movement can encompass an enormous rance of interests and directions．A movement is concerned with cultural ai personal attitudes as well as those normally thought of as politicul．

It's function would be to facilida由e communication and the sharing of resources and contacts between different green projects and groups throughout the counties of Britain. This might be done in a number of ways. The following would be a start:-

1) A regular bi-mnthly mailing with information, news and dates.
?) nuarterly gatherings(indoors and out) focused around small group meetings and celebration. These will provide invaluable space for personal connunication and the generation of new ideas and schemes. The different groups present would be able to plan and co-ordinate their events ${ }_{3}$ and campaigns so as to avoid date clashes etr.
2) A computerised infnrmation base including a directoxy of local contacts and people with specialist skills and knowledge.

Greenlands Farm, Glastonbury, 6-8 Sept.
This Forum consisted of meetings between various groups and people involved with Festivals within a very informal gathering of "The Children of the Rainbow". Right up tothe last minute it was not certain whether the exent would be able to take place on this site because of eviction proceedings against the 200 or so travellers living illegally (? ) on that land. The issues surrounding the situation were immediate manifestations of the sort of problems which have beset festivals, perticularly in relation to the travelling community, or 'Convoy' as the press would put it. The fears experienced at festivals over the last few years surrounding the convoy have been mostly due to a lack of co-operation, communication, and respect between organisers, travellers, press and police. It was the expressed intention of the forum to begin dealing with these tensions and misunderstandings. Trying to formalise this process, in a situation of diverse, immediate demands on all the people gathered there, was almost impossible.
There were representatives of variousmagazines, festival list makers, organisers, performeres. travellers, peace campers, and individuals concerned with the future well-being of the festivals. Together we drew up an Agenda for the weekend, which consisted of sessions on our visions; media and publicity; Legal matters; sites and park-ups; Festival Aid group; proposals for next year's European Green Gathering; the Travellers Skool;Theatre of vision; we opened with a session calledx"Organisation and Anarchy". This was perhaps a mistake, given that it is almost a contradiction in terms and with the amount of organisation which had gone into making the forum happen, it was a relief that we agreed thet'co-ordination'as opposed to ' manipulation' was acceptable practise, The orientation was definitely towards the Free Festivals, particularly in then light of the events sorrounding the attempt to stop the 'People's Free Flestival at Stonehenge. Jith all the issues and emotions crystallised on this issue, it was not only impractical to hold general meetings on Stonehenge, etc. but Innappropriate to expect that such meetings could do anything about it. It was however very important that these issues around Police powers, personal responsability and politios shopld be raised and shared informally in frder toclear the wieght of rumours, prejudices, and projections which were keeping us apart.

Things became more organic, informal discussions and arguments were engaged in whilst some if the smaller, specific task meetings took place and succeeded in sor out plans for the ongoing work towards a secure future for the festivals. Hetere we, distinct lack of mutual co-operation and no conmcluding session took place, sotha: some people left with no clesr sense of what had been achieved, patticularly in thowe sessions where they were not present...And so it is withthe life of the Festival Movement itself, a large, unraly, indefinable beast. The vision of setting up communication between all festivals to resolve this obscurity and draw together a strong, united movement was aiming far too high; but the happening brought together many people and the person-to-person links that were made are in reality the foundations on which a solid future, in truth, can be built.

## ENGLISH HERITAGE / STONEHENGE 86 MEATING

October I4th: Fortress House, Saville Row.
At the invitation of English Heritage, John Michell and others got together a group of some 20 representatives of various groups with a concern for the Solstice celebrations at Stonehenge, which included Hippies (wot?), Druids, Pagans, Pilgrims, Tree FoIk, Greens, Anarchists, Welfare groups and individuals. The brief was to work out how to stage an ordered ahd safe event for the Solstice day at the s+nnehenge site (which E.H. manage, taking over control from the Department of the Environment last yemr) without there being a return of the Festival.
Three hours of talks followed, centering on the archeological worries of the authorities (there were also representatives of the National Trust Present) and the w' $\mathrm{w}^{\prime}$. of the people to hold the festival. It was pointed out that in previous years there $r$ : never been a problem with the number of people at the stones themselves at any one $t$ : last year for example when there were only perhaps 3,000 people out of the $30 ; 000+$ at the festival who passed to the stones over the period of the Solstice, the groups involved in ceremonies organically sorted out their own timing. It seemed fairly clear
(Stonehenge cointinued)
that there was ultimately no reason(apart from ignorance and fear) why the Nationat Trust could not provide an alternative文 site on archeologically inert land within walking distance of the Stones and that the reasons that were their concern could all be resolved through communication and co-operation.
There was a great exchange of ideas and feelings on both sides, and a genuine desire to avoic any repetition of the violence if this summer. Care for the site at and round Stonehenge (even just ecological care!) meant that the festival could not continue to grow any bierer or longer; it must therefore chance, become more organised (legal?). Therecouldbe no satisfactory way of holdinc a limited Solstice observance at tha stones without there being a Festival of soile kind nearby. It seum like tha problems with damage, drugs, rubbish ans health conld be resolved, as could the finding of a suitable site, with the beginnins of a new I2-year cycle on an air of positive co-operation; these meetings can commiunicate understanding and create the trust needed for a practical compromise. This left us all with a great deal to think about, particularly, I think, for English Heritage and the National Trust to assimilate the feelings and ideas of which they had previously no idea. We felt strong, positive, if a little hampered and suspicious of the bureaucracy.

MOLESWORTH PLOUCHSHARTS AND TOOLS FOR ERITREA.
The Iolesworth Ploughshares Campaign started ith Molesworth in Aprili984 when hundreds trespassed on the base to plant wheat for ${ }^{2} \mathrm{e}$ starvi.. 3 in Tritrea(presentiy occupied by Ethiopia).
Most of this first crop and the second crop, planted during the Harvest forthe Hungry Green Gathering was trampled over and destroyed when Hesseltine's"shock troops" evicted the Rainbow Village last February.
The campaign to send wheat to the starving in Eritrea has, however, continued. Nearly 150 tonnes of wheat for emergency famine rejief has now
 and children's clothing. When tha rains finally began in May the Molesworth wheat fund was able to contribute over 810,000 worth of seeds for the Eritreans first crop in th: oc yoars.
Their first concern now, howevcr, is to regain their self reliance. For this they need tools, particularly spades, hoes, animal drawn ploughs and harrows. This winter, groups are being asked to collect and re-furbish tools of all kinds in preparation for th 'Digger' g Walk' next easter when people will march to Molesworth carrying the tools they have collected. In a mass civil disobedience tiney will then try out the tools 浸 on the base, demonstrating opposition to cruise an determinationthat the land be used for peaceful purposes.
All participants are being asked to take part in specific 'Digger's Walk' non-violent training sessions and to abide by the principles of concuct outlined for it. ## NTMS FROM MOLTSWORTH ．．．

There fre now thref pance comps at Molesworth，including a Christian CND camp outside the o末d Raimbow Village site，an anarchist camp in the peace garden，and the Peonles＇Peace Camp on the other side of the bese in Warren Lane．Incursions into the base happen on an almost dajly basis and the police have to bring in reinforcements every weekend．Any support would be enormously appreofiated and any new prople would be extremely welcome．

Greer Day：Some 400 poople attended the Green Day at Moleaworth on November $23 r d$. Small－scale ctions occurred at different parts of the perimeter and some 10 or 12 peonte were arrested．Paul Johns，the new Chair of CND，spoke at Peace Corner， and three Greer Party women chained themselves to a barricade in front of the main Peace Corner gate．

This demonstration and a number of other activities seemed to have impressed the CND Inadership．They have increased Green CND＇s anrual budget for next year， whilst cutting that of Liber臿五 and Labour CND ：

The Alconbury／Molnsworth Land Furd：has now rnached the point of exchanging con－ tracts with the landowner，who will otherwise be forced to sell his land to make way for the now cruise link road at Molesworth．Those of you who have bought Iand should be receiving conveyances before the new year．

Flackjacket Day ．．．February 6th 1986：CND are commemorating the eviction of the Rainbow Village last February with a mass blockade of all antrances to the base． The action will begin at 6 am on Thursday February 6th．The Green Collective was involved in setting；this should certaimly be a sate for our diaries．Spread the wrord，form affinity groups and prepare．Details from Ross MacKenzie at CND，22－2马 Underwood Street，London NI 7JQ．

## Snowballing ．．．．．

Many of you will be familiar with the Snowball campaign which has been takimg nlace at different bases in Britain for a number of months．The campaign began at USAF Sculthorpe in Norfolk，but has now become more focussed on the cxulse missile base in Cambridgeshire．Every two months or so，increasing numbers of peonle gather at these bases to symbolically and operly cut the fence．The police and press are informed of the details well in advance．The actions are undertaken in the spirit of nonviolerice．Anyome who wants to participate is asked to corduct themselves in this spirit．

The latest Snowball took place on the weekend of Novembor 9 th and 1 Cth ．Roger Framklim ond Pete Brown had earlier beor arrested for＇incitement to commit criminal damage＇whilst leafleting for the action at the CND demonstration on October 26 th． For this and a number of other Molesworth－related offences，Pete Brown is expect－ ing a 20 to 30 －day prison sentence over the Christmas neriod．If anyone would like to semd him a card or some flowers，he＇s almost certain to be in Gloucester prison．

Some one hundred and fifty poople attended the last Snowball at Molesworth． About 40 of these were arrested eventually．Initlally the police adopted a＇no arrests＇policy．It was only after an hour and a half of continuous attempts to cut the fence that the oolice reluctantly began their arrests．It fis clear from their gereral attitude that the authorities do not want Molesworth back in the headlines，and will therefore do whatever they can to avoid mass arrests．

The next Snowball will be held at bases all over Britain on January 18 tr／19th． The Molesworth snowball is asking for 350 volunteers．If you would like to take part n，ease register with Pete Brown at 23 Victoria Park，Fishponds，Bristol BS I6． Registration for Snowball activities at other bases should be done through Angie Zelta at Vallny Hope Farm，East Runton，Cromer，Norfolk．A new briefing is also available from the above address．

Some of you will heve noticed from the press that the Ecoloey Party has recontly decided to change its name to 'Greenl. This comes more than four years after the Ecology Party Gathering Collective made the same decision. The ironic thing is that, our drcision was based on a desire to avold belng exclusively associnted with the Ecology Party ! Perhans the lesson here is that 'green' is so fugely popular as to mean that all perts of the wider movement must learn to co-operate more fully, and to avold centralised exclusive monopoloies, if we are to honestly share the green label.

## GRTFNLANDS FARM, Glastonbury

Since the last issue of the Mailing, travellers all over the country have beem coming under more and more pressure, and the site nt Greentands Farm has now been closed down after a serfes of court cases. Alison Collyer, the landowner, refrmed to the High Court on Octaber 30th to be given a six month sentence - skspended for one month - fon failing to comply with the narlier injunction to clear the site. She was also rafused legal aid with which to fight this cnse or to evict the travellers, who eventually appeared before Yoovil County Court on December 4 th.

This was the first time they had been given tho chance to speak for themselves In the matter, and ss a result the court gave them a further 14 days to leave, "the maximum the law will allow in the circumstances". On Decrmber 6th Alison returned to the High Court yet again, when her prisn sentence was deferred for annther month.

Local formers have voluntcored to pull trucks and buses out of the appalline mud; and as we go to press, all but a few stragglers have left and it appears that the anger of Alison going to prison has been averted. The behaviour of the local District Council - who used the throat to Alison and rumours of vieilantes and riot police to persuade the travellers to move - and the local press - whith has kept up the most disernceful smear campaien for months of end - has had to be exporienced to be believed.

Leaving Greenlands Farm has not helped the travellers to find somewhere f.se to go for the wirter, whilst local authorities all over the country are busy evicting squats and illegal park-ups, Somerset Coumty Council have been dragging theif feet over their statutory responsibilities to provide legal transit sites; but they have already found that the 'ptoblem' will not simply $g$ o away, as most people from Greenlands have moved on to land owned by the Council in othef parts of the County.

ince the late 1;60's and earlyl $70^{\circ}$ s, free festivals have grown to be an inportent part of the alternative culture, and many of the individuals involved in such a scene from the begininc havethemselves, and inspired others to, spend the entire summer-if not their entire lifestylet travelling from site to site, many in converted buses and trucks. Indivual skills have been put to use as travelling stillholders, siteworkers and entertainers become a foundation and focus for mieny events. is peiple relate more to the travelling lifestyle and less to the crumbling noral/social fabric of inner cities, travelling croups have been formed, sharing resources, and these eroups are still encountering the same problems and prejudices fisom the ceneral public as eypsies have been encounterine for centuries. They are also victims of distorted media hysteria("Illegal hippy gun convoy in sex berror") and police hacaasment,mostly because of the misunderstood, alienated and persucuted drunken minority who tade along locing for some lind of freedom and respect. The travellers school project addresses itself to the develonoement of the children growing up in the middle of all this. In 1.03 it was estimate : that their were the children of a eroup of about 350 people 'on the roan' and this number has doubled each year. Within the travelling coamunity there are a large proportion of childrein who recieve no state schooling whatsoever; this is largely due to the way travelling peoples see the irrelevancy of state school education and it's values in the context of their children' ren's lifestyle and welfare.Life ' on the road' for many children is both fascinatine and hard making immedaete denands on their resourcefulness; they learn by experience to deal with a wide variety of kammeople and situations. At each new site there is a different environment to explore, offering endless educational possibilities in ecology,geography, history, science, technology and sociology. "ithin the travelling community and especially at festivals thereare people with a wide range of skills, knowledge, and enthusiasms which they would be more than willing to share; but these potentials for more conceptual (formal) learning are rarely realised. Iostly this is due to lack of resources, energy, and continuity cauced by the pressures of travelling, poverty, and harrasment. What is needed is a communal space into which activities can be focussed.
we would like your help in establishing a school for the travellers children, fitted out withworl-tops, cupboards, display space, and equiptmentto travel to appropriate festivals over the summer, and either tour the sites or to stay in one large settlement cver the winter. It would bethe responsibility ofdriver- teachers tohelp co-ordinate activities and focus project work, incorporatingthe basic skills of literacy, numeracy, and communication, in order that the children can better understand and express their disceascras overies. The nature of the education we hope to provide is flexible and child centred, an indivually based system relevant to the multicultural society in which we now live.
Cbviously, to establish such a project, we would need funds in order to purchase and equip the vehicle, as well as to pay the waces of at least two full time teachers. Before we can seek such funds, I feel there needs to be a cominittee formed to establish the basic outline of the project, giving a broad base of support to apply for fundinjand to oversee/nanage it's $r$ running. Eventually we would hope to find perranent fundin from th ecvernment education dept., but at present there is not a category into whi ch such an educational facility easily fits. I would be pleased to reciewe correspondance on this matter, and to meet with interested parties at your convenience.
